JOSH PEDDE Artistic Director

Joshua N. Pedde, artistic director for the Indianapolis Children's Choir (ICC), has been with the organization for over fifteen years, serving as a teacher, director and assistant artistic director. Mr. Pedde was instrumental in growing the ICC's Innovations

workshops to public and private schools throughout central Indiana.

Mr. Pedde is a frequent conductor and clinician throughout the United States. He has conducted the LCMS Worship Institute Children's Choir, both the WELS National Worship Convention Festival and Children's Choirs, American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) all state choirs in Kentucky and New Mexico, Indiana Music Education Association honor choir, and honor choirs and workshops throughout the United States. He has conducted at Kennedy Center and Lincoln Center, and he has traveled throughout Europe preparing and conducting choirs for performances.

Mr. Pedde is a member of the National Association for Music Educators, American Choral Directors Association, John Feierabend Association Choral Committee, and Indiana Music Education Association (IMEA). He is also a member of the Indiana Choral Directors Association where he has served on the board and as Repertoire and Standards chair for Boy's and Children's Choirs.

Mr. Pedde earned his bachelor of music degree in vocal music education and a master's degree in choral conducting from Butler University. In addition, he holds a Director of Parish Music certification from Concordia University Chicago. He has received training in Orff-Schulwerk, Kodály, and First Steps methods of teaching.



HENRY LECK Artistic Director

An internationally recognized choral director, Henry Leck is a professor emeritus in choral music at Butler University, where he served on the faculty for 27 years. He is the Founder and Conductor Laureate of the Indianapolis Children's Choir, which he served as Artistic Director for 30 years. Under his leadership, the organization grew to be one of the largest and

most respected children's choir programs in the world. The touring choirs of the Indianapolis Children's Choir have performed regularly for national ACDA, MENC, OAKE and AOSA Conferences. Additionally, the ICC tours internationally every year.

In the state of Indiana, Mr. Leck is the founding conductor of the Indiana Children's Allstate Honor Choir. He also founded and conducted the Indiana Middle School Honor Choir. He is a frequent conductor of regional and national honor choirs, including the ACDA Southern, Southwest, North Central, Central, Western and Northwest Honors Choirs. In the spring of 2003, he conducted the ACDA National Junior High/Middle School Honor Choir in New York City and in 2011, the ACDA National Children's Honor Choir in Chicago. On three occasions he has conducted National Honor Choirs for OAKE. For twenty-two years, he has conducted National Youth Choral Festivals in Carnegie Hall annually. Mr. Leck and the choir received the Indiana Governor's Arts Award, which is the highest honor one can receive in the arts in Indiana. Recently Mr. Leck was named a recipient of the "Lowell Mason Fellows Award" by the National Association for Music education.

Mr. Leck received his training from the University of Wisconsin — Stevens Point, the University of Colorado and Indiana University.

The Indianapolis Children's Choir nurtures and inspires student achievement through quality music education and the pursuit of artistic excellence in choral music performance.

Every week the Indianapolis Children's Choir (ICC) provides music education to approximately 2,500 students in central Indiana. Founded in 1986 by artistic director Henry Leck, the ICC nurtures and inspires student achievement through quality music education and the pursuit of artistic excellence in choral music performance. The 2016-2017 season marks the introduction of Artistic Director Joshua Pedde, as the ICC enters a new era.

Housed on the campus of Butler University in Indianapolis, participants in the ICC's programs represent the diversity of central Indiana with children from nearly 20 counties, including all of the Indianapolis area suburbs and nearby rural communities. These children come from more than 359 schools and 56 school districts. Each week, the ICC holds 110 rehearsals and music classes.

APPLICATION INFORMATION

To apply for participation in the National Choral Festival in Indianapolis, Indiana go to nationalchoralfest. com, click on Application and fill out your application. No fee is required at the time of application. Once accepted into the festival, choral groups are expected to pay a \$250 non-refundable deposit within 2 weeks of acceptance. Accepted candidates are notified via email.

PRICE

\$599 per singer, based on quad occupancy \$659 per singer, based on triple occupancy \$769 per chaperone or staff, based on double occupancy \$1,099 per chaperone or staff, based on single occupancy

PAYMENTS

Deposit: A \$250 non-refundable deposit is required within 2 weeks or application acceptance. **Final Payment:** The balance due is to be paid in full by Wednesday, April 4, 2018.

Based upon when the original deposit is received, the subsequent payments will be due as follows: January 4, 2018 (50% of total invoice)

February 28, 2018 (75% of total invoice)

April 4, 2018 Final balance (100% of the total invoice)

If group cancels less than 30 days | before departure, the group will be charged 100% of the group's tour price plus any non-refundable deposit and non-refundable tour costs

If the group cancels 60 to 30 days | before departure, the group will be charged 75% of the group's tour price plus any non-refundable deposit and non-refundable tour costs

If the group cancels 61 to 90 days | before departure, the group will be charged 50 % of the group's tour price plus any non-refundable deposit and non-refundable tour costs.

If the group cancels 91 to 120 days | before departure, the group will be charged 25 % of the group's tour price plus any non-refundable deposit and non-refundable tour costs.

If the group cancels 121 to 199 days | before departure, the group will be charged 10 % of the group's tour price plus any non-refundable deposit and non-refundable tour costs.
